9. Maximum number of teams will be 36, this year there were 29 teams of 4 golfers.
10. Scan pictures that were taken to send out with flyers next year.
11. Golfers were quiet and respectful during the reading of the Proclamation honoring Al Batten. It was noted they are usually noisy after dinner.
12. There were 17 baskets donated, plus Phillies tickets, 2 golf shirts & golf hat were used for door prizes.
